In contrast, illegal edible cannabis: can confuse children by mimicking popular brands of candies and snacks; and can contain very high amounts of THC, which increases the risk of severe 	 Symptoms can include: Vomiting Confusion Drowsiness/lethargy Slurred speech Selzures (rare) Suspect a poisoning? Cati your local poison centre or 9-1-1 for emergencies. Say that you suspect the symptoms are from canabis. A quicker diagnosis can prevent serious harm to a child.
