

Board of Health Meeting March 28, 2024

Summary

Voluntary Merger

The Leeds, Grenville and Lanark Board of Health voted in support of the intent to merge with Kingston, Frontenac, and Lennox & Addington Public Health and Hastings Prince Edward Public Health to create the South East Health Unit at its March 28, 2024 meeting.

All three Boards approved moving forward with an intent to voluntarily merge and submitted a business case to the Ministry on April 2, 2024.

Consultants Sense and Nous were contracted to prepare a feasibility study and business case to explore impacts of a voluntary merger and collaborated with each health unit to develop these reports.

Feasibility Study

The Merger Feasibility report was developed to assist in the decision-making process that outlines strategic opportunities and challenges associated with the proposed merger among the three health units. Merger Feasibility Summary Report

Update from Tri-Board Merger Committee

During the month of March, Chair Peter McKenna, Vice Chair Robin Jones, and Dr. Li gave presentations to municipal councils regarding the merger exploration and further communication will take place in the coming weeks.

Guiding principles were developed at the Tri-Board to articulate a collective vision in merger explorations with fluid principles that transition as the organization matures.
