13. Planning for 2025 Discussion

EAC is expected to present a budget to the Town by the end of September 2024. It seems that operating and reserve funds will each have: \$3000

1. Waste Diversion

Organic Composting is continuing. Just Good Compost is one example.

Recommendations can be made by EAC for the next Solid waste contract.

Action: Barb is to compile a list re: waste diversion.

Plan to have the Waste App up and running before Christmas.

Action: Colin and Derek to work on the Waste App.

2. Naturalizing and Biodiversity

Naturalizing and Biodiversity are a continuation of what we are doing.

Action: Laura to suggest a budget for Sept. for the Town, in regards to town, private and commercial properties.

3. Climate Mitigation and Adaptation to be put on hold.

4. **Transportation**

Transportation study to be conducted next year by the Town. Car share and ride share programs should be included. EAC could consider conducting a community study

Anti-idling is on hold.

5. Night skies

EAC could consider public education about night skies and reducing excess lighting.
